Jesus used "words" and "actions" to convey God's message

During Lent the weekly study and the sermon each week have focused upon one of the 7 last words of Jesus while he was dying upon the cross. Those 7 words include the following:

- --a word of **FORGIVENESS** "...Father forgive them..."
- --a word of **SALVATION** today you will be with Me in paradise"
- --a word about **FAMILY** Mother, behold your son..."
- --a word of **ABANDONMENT** "my God, my God, why have Your forsaken me?"
- --a word of **DISTRESS** "...I thirst"
- --a word of **COMPLETION** "It is finished!"
- --and Easter gives us one more word: He is Risen!

As our themes focus on the important and significant words Jesus spoke at the very end of his life; there is one action in the Garden of Gethsemane that Jesus used to send a final message to Caiaphas the High Priest. John's gospel tells of Peter drawing his sword and slicing off the right ear of Malchus, a soldier in service to the chief priest. Why include all these details? Have you ever wondered why John names this servant but not the rich young ruler? (John 18:10)

We have all kinds of people in the gospels who don't get named, why does this slave? What does it mean to have this information from John and also in Luke's gospel? Consider what would have happened as the Centurion in charge returned with his report to the Chief Priest.

The temple guard could have included up to 200 soldiers (a cohort is from 100-200 men). After the arrest, the centurion and his servant would have gone back to make his report to Caiaphas the chief priest. The conversation might have gone like this: Caiaphas: well how did it go? Centurion: We got him. Any problems? Yes. What? One guy drew a sword. Who? That big fisherman. Peter? Yup. Did anybody get hurt? Yes. He hit someone? Yes. Who? My servant. Let me see. He looks ok. He is now. What do you mean? Well...?

Caiaphas (to the servant): Let me get this straight. He hurt you? Yes. Where? Cut my ear off. He cut your ear off? It looks ok now. It is.

Caiaphas (to the Centurion): So what's wrong? Centurion: This whole deal is wrong! What do you mean? Centurion: Do you really want to go through with this execution? He touched my servant's ear and healed him. Right there in the garden?

It was Jesus' last miraculous act, a gift of love to God's high priest. He saw what was coming. He knew it was his time. Jesus saw where the sequence of events were leading: Judas—the betrayal; Peter—his denial; the other disciples—they all ran away; Caiaphas—the treachery; The soldiers—father forgive them for they know not what they do. Jesus named the action of his followers and extended them grace even before they failed.

He poured out grace and forgiveness all along this agonizing journey to the cross. Even on the cross he spoke it. He didn't run out, he didn't reach his limit, it wasn't like a charge card—maxed out before he reached the end. His capacity for forgiving was not exhausted by all the evil around him. He never ran out—contrary to us.

May we open ourselves to the depth of God's love and mercy and extend the same to others,


Staff positions in transition



ATTENTION MEMBERS AND FRIENDS:

If you write a check payable to The Center to make a donation to them, a couple of procedures need to change. The Church's bank will no longer accept checks made



out to The Center and will not allow us to deposit them into the Church's bank account. Starting immediately when you write a check for a donation to The Center that is separate from your donation to the Church, you need to make the check payable to St. John's United Methodist Church and then put "The Center" in the Memo line on the check. The Church office will ensure that the money is credited to The Center. If your donation to The Center is included in your check for your donation to the Church, you do not need to change anything. Your check can still be made out to the St. John's UMC and you can continue to break out your donation between the Church and The Center in the Memo line. In addition, we cannot accept checks made out to UMCOR or other Church projects/missions. They need to be made out to St. John's UMC; UMCOR (or other project/mission name) should be put in the Memo line on the check. If we receive checks made out to UMCOR/similar outside organizations, we will have to return them to you and have you rewrite the check to St. John's. Again, we will make sure that the noted organization receives your donation.
