## Pastor's Page – February 2024



When people pray, things happen. I have been inviting the congregation of St. John's to grow a little deeper in prayer this January. If you have tough issues, try prayer. If you have health difficulties, try prayer. If you struggle with controlling people or anxiety...try prayer!

I share this story from recent history to encourage you to have faith when facing life challenges. In 1989, the wall came down in East Berlin and 10 East European countries suddenly found themselves free from communist control. Historians cite various reasons for this significant event but one factor is usually overlooked: a prayer meeting in the city of Leipzig.

For 40 years the church in East Germany had prayed for change to their circumstances. They cared for the poor and met every Monday night to pray and worship. Since 1982, Rev. Christian Fuehrer had met with a few people in his church on Mondays to pray. Seven years later there were four churches praying together each week, the numbers increasing even as ordinary townspeople joined their Christian neighbors. After each meeting, the people took candles and peacefully marched through the city.

The communist authorities debated how best to stop the marchers. The secret police issued death threats to church leaders and roughed up some of the marchers. But the crowds kept growing...as many as 50,000 marchers came some weeks towards the end of the summer.

On October 9, 1989, police and army units moved into Leipzig. Many participants feared it would all end in a massacre. The East German commander gave permission for troops to use force, but the prayer meeting and march went as planned: 70,000 people marched; the following Monday 120,000; and a week later 500,000 people filled the streets. By November 1, one million marchers swelled the streets of East Berlin. Then something amazing happened! Marchers crossed into West Berlin and the police stood by without firing a shot. The Berlin Wall and all that it symbolized had just crumbled.

What's your big issue this month? What's the one area you most desire God to work? If prayer could bring down a wall, and eventually the Iron Curtain...might it open the door for you to experience God's grace and help today? Keep the faith!

## Saturday, Feb. 17 @ 5:30 – Guest speaker: seeing the Messiah in the Passover

Dr. Michael Herts will share this message as the speaker for our Jesus Country worship service. The public is invited to attend. He comes to give our Christian community insight into Jewish traditions so that the Jewish roots of Christianity can be better understood. He will start with all the components of a typical Passover Seder meal and explain the symbolic meanings for each item of the Passover feast; highlighting the relationship to the Last Supper which Jesus celebrated with his disciples.




## Lenten Study Series:
