

### Annual Conference Summary: June 2-4

### Delegates from St. John's: Pastor Jeff and Pastor Jae, Gail Bindewald—Lay Delegate

This year's session included a Zoom night on May 23, specifically called to act on churches that had voted to disaffiliate or leave the lowa Annual Conference. These churches had each followed a discernment process in regards to how they would go forward in regards to the human sexuality issues facing General Conference and including LGBT persons in the life of the church. In a one-hour meeting, 83 churches were approved for this action. The Zoom session closed with a liturgy of farewell and blessing as our conference experiences a parting of ways. There are 732 United Methodist churches in the



whole of Iowa. You recall, on May 9, St. John's congregational meeting ended with a decision to remain in the Iowa Annual Conference.

Annual Conference began on a Friday afternoon, meeting at the MidAmerican Rec / Plex hockey arena in West Des Moines. We experienced a new bishop as leader of Annual Conference business: *Bishop Kennetha Bigham-Tsai*, who came to lowa on January 1 of this year. She revealed herself as a leader that could keep her composure in moments of tension, and navigate the use of parliamentary procedure as motions were made and amended. She surprised us at the beginning of Saturday morning with a playful beginning: since we were meeting in a hockey arena, she came running down the center aisle with helmet and facemask, hockey jersey and stick... only to be escorted to the penalty box by her two teenage sons for a 30 second timeout. There were many items of church business dealt with and ministry celebrations throughout the weekend.

Sunday morning the bishop was our preacher: "Remember who you are as baptized followers of Christ." Three pastors were ordained, seven pastors were commissioned, and 12 others were recognized or transferred into the Iowa Conference, with 34 pastors retiring from full-time ministry. The conference ended on Sunday afternoon with the "fixing of appointments" in which Pastor Jeff and Pastor Jae were continued as pastors here at St. John's for another year.
