### <u> Pastor's Page – March 2024 Old Testament Heroes</u>



During Lent we are learning the stories of 5 Old Testament names that stand out in many ways as heroes of the faith. Hebrews chapter 11 includes these 5 names in a list that stands out like a biblical "hall of fame." They are: Noah, Abraham, Moses, David and Jeremiah.

The Old Testament has been characterized by some as dusty, boring, and obscure history. But when you actually read the Bible, you find it more of interest than one might expect. These important Bible leaders were not included in the Bible because they were perfect, nor were they included because they were better than everyone else. I'm finding that they are in the

Bible because they were chosen by God, and they said "yes." As we read Genesis chapters 6-10 we meet the man called Noah. Then in Genesis 12 we meet Abraham & Sarah. As their stories unfold, we do see people of faith but they also stumble and fall. We see how they trust God and we see them in all their human frailties. The heroes of the Old Testament have doubts about God's plan and fears for the future. Yet God still chooses to work with these fallible individuals, just as God chooses to work with us.

I hope you come along for the rest of our Sunday series: Remembering God's Covenants. The midweek Bible study with the pastors have been reading the larger story along with each of our Sunday "heroes" that are featured in the sermon each week. Each of these leaders lived a life that was a mixture of faithfulness and struggle. There is drama and intrigue, times of testing and seasons of celebration. The Bible includes the stories of real people, with real flaws.

People like you and people like me. They also had a hunger for something more than this world can satisfy. Maybe you feel that hunger too. Hope to see you in worship this weekend.

The church finished 2023 in the positive thanks to members who made extra donations in December. Following is a summary of the 2023 financial information:


The cash receipts for January include pledges paid in December 2023 that are for 2024 plus some people pay their entire 2024 pledge in January.

#### Church History shared by the History Committee

Patriotism has been a strong theme in our church's history. Our earliest existing membership records date from a few years before the Civil War. During that war period there were a number of church members listed in the early records as soldiers or as "gone to war". No doubt there were St. John's members who served in the Spanish American conflict and in World War One.

We have a number of records from the World War Two era. There were 190 St. John's men and women who served in the various branches of the U.S. military during WW II. A church group called W.A.Y.S. met during that time to send gifts and letters to service people to support their effort. The History Room has a large shadow box filled with military shoulder patches. These were donated by St. John's members and they represent many of the service units from WW II. We also have a pocket sized New Testament printed in 1941 by the U.S. Army. These were given to servicemen. This one belonged to Dennis Hansen, who may have been a relative of a former member.

Did you notice the large board formerly in the basement opposite the Wheel and more recently on the south wall of the Perry St. lobby? It is filled with plaques bearing the names of some of our members who served in the military. Most of these people served during WW II. The board was started about 1942. Even that long list of proud veterans is not a complete list of all the current and former St. John's members who have served our country over the years since then.

#### Dear Friends,

The St. John's Foundation was established to provide opportunities for people to make permanent gifts for the financial support of our church. The Foundation receives gifts through insurance, wills, and other forms of charitable giving that are invested to provide income which is then available for funding special projects for St. John's Church and The Center.



The Foundation received multiple grants this past December totaling more than \$110,000 and granted the following on January 31st, 2024: A Parlor A/C and Heating Unit: \$9,779, Sunday School Classroom A/C and Heating Units: \$7,918, A Chapel Sequencer: \$877.86, Microphone Replacements for the Choir: \$4,002.00, Tender Loving Care Supplies for Outreach: \$400, Office Computer Upgrades: \$5013.70, Power Supply Backup: \$1,944.87, The Center Square Project: Parking Lot \$40,000. The Oasis Project: The Foundation Committee has held back funds to continue supporting this project.

Thank you to everyone for your continued support of the St. John's Foundation and thank you to the committee members of this group for your time and efforts in support of our church. Blessings to all as we venture through 2024. -Molly Giese
