Reflections on faith and death: for All Saints Day

The story is told of two men viewing a famous painting of a chess game. One character in the painting looked like a despairing young man; the other looked very much like the devil. The young man had come to his final move. The title of the painting was *Checkmate*. One of those viewing the painting was an international chess champion. Something about the painting had captured his attention and he wanted to linger. His partner grew impatient and asked what he was doing. The chess champion answered, "Something about this painting is not right. I want to study it for a while. You go ahead and look around."

When the friend came back, the chess master declared, "We must locate the artist that painted this piece! He must either change the picture or change the title."

His friend asked, "What's wrong with the painting?"

The chess champion replied, "It's titled *Checkmate*, but that's wrong. <u>The king still has one more move</u>!"

When Jesus was arrested in Jerusalem, he was put on trial, then beaten and mocked, and finally nailed to a cross to die.
