A word from the Pastor One of my favorite Bible verses is Psalm 34:8 "O taste and see that the Lord is good." I believe in the goodness of God even though life is difficult and challenging at times. For me, the struggles of life do not take away from this characterization of what God is like. I recently discovered the word "honey" occurs quite often in Scripture. Honey is mentioned 61 times In the Bible. The words of scripture are described as sweeter than honey and the laws of God are compared with the flavor of honey. In the third chapter of Exodus, when God called Moses to lead the slaves out of Egypt, he called him to lead them to a land of promise...flowing with milk and honey.



God created the small honeybees that find nectar and refine it into honey and then store it in their hives. We share our love for the flavor of honey with bears, raccoons, skunks, badgers and Winnie the Pooh. And God is the One who originally thought up honey. But understand this. A God with no stomach or taste buds, with no sweet tooth and no need for calories invented the recipe for honey just to be enjoyed by the rest of creation. God devised its texture, spread ability, longevity, and medicinal properties. He choreographed the elaborate dance of the bees that would be followed to make this delight, and God smiled. Then God spoke it all into being, and behold, it was good!



Our schools are in session, we're seeing cool nights and the leaves are turning. The Food Pantry collected 151 items for September. Monetary donations for August was \$370.00! Our Church History

At over 100 years old, St. John's has accumulated a number of artifacts which help us remember its past. These items can be found in various locations around the building. Here are a few of these objects and a suggestion of what they might remind us of.

In the parlor you can find: A pair of walnut pastor's chairs, probably either from the 9th and Brady church or the 14th St. Church, remind us of past locations of our Methodist congregation before 1902.

A framed brochure with original church layout from 1903 points to the hopes and plans of our predecessors for a beautiful and vibrant church.

In the History Committee Room, we have:

A newel post lamp and a hymn number board are also reminders of a remodel of the sanctary. Several Sunday school chairs, dating from before 1930 up to 1980, speak of the many generations of children who have been taught here. Old bibles bearing publication dates such as: 1829, 1849, 1874- the earliest one pre-dates the first Methodist building in Davenport.

Two books which belonged to Fayette Thompson, first pastor of St. John's, include a 1905 Methodist hymnal and Holy Bible. Many pastors have served our church over the years since Dr Thompson.

On display in the Conference Room:

Lawyer-style bookcases hold a copy of Phebe Sudlow's manuscript of our church history. An engraved spoon in the tall display case points to the name change of this building in 1903 from Central Methodist Church to St. John's.
